Julian Jacobson MA(Oxon), GRSM, ARCM

Julian Jacobson studied at the Royal College of Music, Queen's College, Oxford and with Lamar Crowson, Louis Kentner and Arthur Benjamin, and was also a founder-member of the National Youth Jazz Orchestra. He has performed as a soloist, duo and ensemble pianist in over 40 countries worldwide, making regular visits to China and Australia in recent years. Performing a huge repertoire, he has become particularly known for his complete Beethoven Sonata cycles, giving his third "marathon" performance of all 32 sonatas in a single day at St Martin-in-the-Fields last October to wide critical acclaim. His large and varied discography ranges from Beethoven and Brahms to Boulez and Michael Nyman. His own compositions and arrangements have been performed by artists such as Steven Isserlis and Lydia Mordkovich, and his recent transcription for piano duet of Gershwin's 2nd Rhapsody has received excellent reviews.

Julian was Head of Keyboard Studies at the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama and is currently a professor at the Royal College of Music and Birmingham Conservatoire, as well as Guest Professor at Xiamen University, China.

Dominic Grier MA(Cantab) PGDip DipRAM ARAM

Dominic will be co-adjudicating the Piano Concerto Class with Julian.

Dominic Grier is widely acknowledged as a young conductor of distinction, whose career already embraces opera, ballet and symphonic work as well as contemporary music and orchestral training. Born in London, he studied at the University of Cambridge and the Royal Academy of Music. He was a permanent staff conductor at the Royal Opera House from 2008 to 2011 (Jette Parker Young Artists Programme), and has served as a regular guest conductor with many of the foremost ballet companies in the UK and Europe. Dominic made a critically acclaimed début at the Opéra National de Lyon in 2010 and had previously worked regularly as an assistant conductor there since 2007. He is increasingly active as a teacher of conducting and is on the faculty at the Royal Academy of Music as Tutor in Conducting. He is also conductor of the Junior Royal Academy of Music's Symphony and Classical orchestras and Music Director of the Worthing Philharmonic Orchestra.
